### Live Nativity Volunteers:


We will need a variety of volunteers for this to be a successful event. Please check the volunteer board in the fellowship hall for ways that you can help.

### *FAITH FORUM: CONNECTING WORD AND DEED*

Many readers will remember the worship-time announcements made by John Prabhakar about the adult Sunday School class 'theme for the day' or even the next Sunday. A couple of years ago, when California began to loom large for Esther and him, John decided it was time to allow others at Faith Lutheran to take responsibility for adult education opportunities in the congregation. Like in real life, it often takes several people to do anywhere near to what one individual has usually been doing. And it has taken some extra time.

We would like to introduce you to Faith Forum: Connecting Word and Deed. This will be the name of our Sunday morning education event for the confirmed members of Faith. It will meet regularly at 9:15 AM every Sunday that there is Sunday School. Pastor Joy brought interest and support to this idea from the outset. In fact the four Bible Studies she has led in November were the first steps in our transition.

With your help Faith Forum will strive to connect the Word of God and our Christian faith to the realities of our personal and community lives, both the believing and the doing. It will seek to undergird your daily walk with Christ, offering a place to study, hear, speak to, and consider prayerfully the questions you have, the problems you face, the opportunities to serve. It will hopefully stretch your mind and commitment, whether in your personal life, your home, this community of faith, the city and the world around us.

We are still in the planning stage for specific topics and presenters, but we are listening to your suggestions, collected a few weeks ago. We are also looking into a regular meeting space. Please talk to Eileen Liezert or David Nelson if you would like to make a topic suggestion for Faith Forum, or if you would like to lead or co-lead a discussion on a Sunday morning. We can't give you all the topics for the year just now, but hope to be able to give you advance notice in this newsletter and the Midweek Memo. Stay tuned.

## Evangelism

### Do you know your neighbors?

Do we know the people that live next to us, work close to us or many people in the community? Do we know the needs of our neighbors? Chances are we don't. It's most likely that the extent of how well we know our neighbors is a wave as we are getting in the car to leave. Unfortunately, that is common in our society today.



I recently attended a Discipleship Gathering hosted by the NI Synod. Pastor Brent Dahlseng discussed the importance of getting to know our neighbors. It's not about increasing the number of people that come in our doors, but increasing the number of personal relationships. I'm not saying that coming to church isn't important, but it's not likely that we will get them to believe and have a relationship with God only by attending a worship service. They can learn about God through our love and genuine concern of what is going on in their lives. As our relationship grows, so can their knowledge of God. God meets us where we are in our lives. Shouldn't we meet our neighbors where they are?

Another question that was raised was "What does your church want to be known for?" Churches do have reputations in the community. I started asking myself that question. A few organizations Faith has helped come to my mind, the Rochelle Area Community Emergency Shelter (R.A.C.E.S), Hand-in-Hand, Hope, and the Community Dinners. I hope that our church is known for how we can reach out and make a difference in our community. Our vision statement, "Making Christ Known through Lives of Faith", reflects the point Pastor Dahlseng mentioned. Through our relationships with others, we can make Christ known.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer said "The Church is the Church only when it exists for others...not dominating, but helping and serving." "Hospitality is not to change people, but to offer them space where change can take place." Is a quote by Henry Nouwen. We need to reach out to our neighbors by going to where our lives can intersect. How about it.....Why don't you meet your neighbor.
