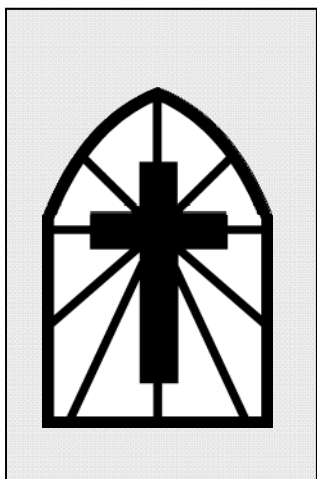

You may be thinking that being an evangelist is just solely the job of a pastor. A common visual that may come to mind when hearing the word evangelist, is the charismatic Tele-evangelist, who enthusiastically preaches God's word from inside huge arenas. We are not like them. We have no formal training to preach God's word. The definition from good old Merriam-Webster says that an evangelist is a person, and especially a preacher who tries to convince people to become Christian. So, let's leave all that evangelizing to the people who are trained to do so, right?

You may know that this Christmas we are putting together a Live (Drive Thru) Nativity Scene on Sunday, December 14th. Usually, it is solely the Sunday school children that participate in the Christmas program. ## Thank offering Sunday

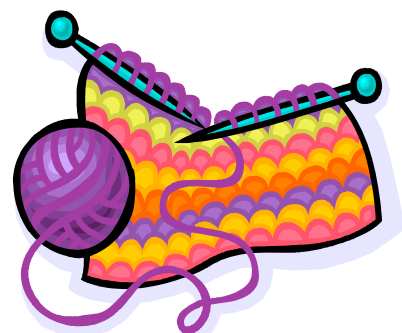
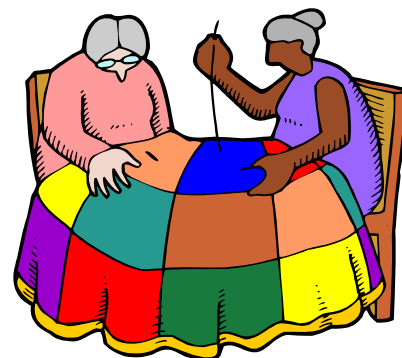
Mark your calendars!

## Council Highlights & Outreach

### Council Highlights – September Edition

- ◆ It was reported that the parking lot work (seal coating and crack repair) had been completed.
- ◆ It was reported that the balance of the Memorial Fund is about \$2,000. \$3,600 was applied towards the mortgage principal and \$3,200 was used to pay for the new banners (both items were completed with the donor's approval). A letter has been drafted to enable people to designate their money in a way that is most meaningful to them at the time of donation. It describes church needs and possible uses for their monetary gifts.
- ◆ The 2015 budget process will begin in the coming weeks.
- ◆ It was discussed to contract with the same person as last year for snow removal.

### Community Suppers

Faith Lutheran continues to participate with St. Pats and other community churches and service clubs to provide one meal a week for the needy in the Rochelle community. On Oct. 13<sup>th</sup> we provided our 14<sup>th</sup> dinner since beginning in August of 2012. During that time period we have served 1321 meals.

We have 4 team captains and they take the lead every fourth month. We usually need 6-8 members for a particular night which includes creating the menu, preparing the food, setting up tables and chairs, decorating the tables, serving the food, and then restoring the hall to it's original condition. This usually requires a commitment from 4:00 – 6:00 PM on the second Monday of each month.

We have many people that serve each month but are looking to create 4 distinct teams. We are always looking for help and look forward to incorporating more youth into this outreach. There is more information on the Adult Sunday School Bulletin Board in the fellowship hall. Team captains are listed .
